# Appropriate wear for outside and updates!

It's starting to get quite chilly outside, so please ensure that you are sending the appropriate outdoor wear for your child(ren)!



### **Temperature guidelines for EASCA:**

- If it is between OC and -1OC the children wear their coat open, mittens, hats and boots. They will need their snowpants if they are playing in the snow.
- If it is between -11C and -22C then the children will be expected to wear their coats (zipped up), mittens, snowpants, hats and boots.
  - Many of the children argue with us about zipping their coat, so please take note that the staff cannot force the children, but we can ask your help in talking to your child about zipping up their coat outside.
- If it -23C and below, the children will be staying inside.



### As per licensing regulations:

- we cannot go outside in the morning until 15 minutes after sunrise.
- we must go back inside 15 minutes **before** the sunset.




## **Pumpkin Carving Pizza Night Update!**
